

VILLA ALBA

Villa Alba is a modern day 'Sleeping Beauty' of a building. Her treasures have lain dormant, hidden from view for almost a century.

At one time, just after completion, in 1884, Villa Alba was the 'toast of the town' both decoratively and socially speaking. 'Table talk' and other commentaries of the day were raving about the



sumptuous beauty of the house. No expense had been spared in its construction, decoration, furnishings and landscaping, which included a fine conservatory to the west and fernery to the east.

Paterson Bros., the foremost decorative artists in Melbourne, had excelled themselves. With a combination of trompe l'oeil and realist painting in panels, they created magnificent ceilings, friezes, dados, murals and, most importantly, the unique panoramas of Edinburgh and Sydney Harbour for all to admire. Every room was painted to a different theme, starting with the 'Scotch' Dining Room as it was called and ascending to the 'Sultan's Palace' boudoir decorated with Moorish motifs and ceiling corners complete with puffs of smoke coming out of little pots!

For a brief time, the owners, Mr & Mrs William Greenlaw, their house furnished to the hilt, and filled with their family of four daughters and two sons, presided over a seemingly idyllic scene. William Greenlaw, a Scottish farmer's son, had risen through the ranks of the Colonial Bank of Australasia, to be Manager, while his wife, the daughter of 'Studley Park' landowner, James McEvoy, orchestrated their social life. Their two acres of land going toward the river even included pasture a cow to graze peacefully. Their four daughters, including little Annie who died young, are thought to be the subjects of the beautiful tile portraits in the Dining-Room fire place.

Alas, in the 1890's, the scenario changed drastically. At a time when many fortunes were lost, the Greenlaws toppled. The dazzling contents of the house being sold by Greenlaw's widow in 1897, effectively drew a curtain around the halcyon days of Villa Alba. Only one piece, the satinwood overmantel mirror painted with scenes from 'A Midsummer Nights Dream' in the Drawing Room, which was recently acquired, can be linked to the original furnishings.

The Fripp Family purchased the house, refurnished it and lived in it well into this century. Thereafter, for a number of years, the princess of houses moved quietly towards oblivion. The romantic, imaginative murals and painted decoration faded from memory. The rooms, for a time, became a home for nurses working in the nearby women's hospital.

A chance interest in the 1980's led to renewed awareness of Villa Alba's importance and her downward spiral was reversed. With the help of the then city of Kew and the owners, St Georges Hospital, a plan was put into place to restore the building and develop it as a decorative arts resource centre thus securing its place in Melbourne's future growth.


Increasing numbers of enthusiastic Melbourne, inter-state and international visitors are rejoicing in the surprisingly intact survival of Villa Alba. It is recognised now that the quality and extent of the painted decoration far surpasses any other comparable house in Australia.

Many people flocked to last year's first 'Villa Alba Decorator Showhouse'. The house burst into life generating much-needed funds for restoration as well as a great deal of energy and excitement.





IKEBANA INTERNATIONAL Serenity in Spring





Simply styled iron and copper hardware is used for handles and locks, and woods such as cypress, cryptomeria, paulownia and zelkova feature predominantly. Most popular among Japanese furnishings is the tansu. They are used to store an amazing variety of items - kimino, swords, bedding, documents, medicinal herbs and tea utensils. Traditionally many tansu did not spend all year inside the Japanese home. They were stored seasonally in the kura (or stockhouse). Side carrying handles and sectional construction for larger furniture made them portable. However it is the practical construction and lean unpretentious design of Japanese furniture that seem to appeal most to Western tastes - that plus the fact that you don't have to "go totally Japanese" to enjoy these pieces. They marry perfectly with both contemporary and traditional western interiors
